NOTE 1: Includes funding provided through the 21st Century Cures Act. The amount in FY21 is \$195 million; in FY22, \$194 million; in FY23, \$216 million.

NOTE 2: OVAC supports ARPA-H as an additional source of research funding using innovative models. The agency should complement NIH and NCI's foundational work, but it should not displace or reduce funding increases to NCI or the rest of NIH. Given that ARPA-H isn't up and running yet, and there are still ongoing conversations about its structure and leadership, OVAC is not prepared to recommend a FY23 funding level for it at this time, but is eager to work with Congress on this new agency moving forward.

NOTE 3: Amount does not include the Wisewoman heart disease program, which is housed within the breast and cervical cancer program. Within the total for this program, OVAC requests at least \$225 million for non-Wisewoman activities.
