NOTE 1: The House Labor-HHS appropriations bill, which includes funding for all of these programs except for the FDA, was approved by the House Appropriations Committee but was not considered on the House floor. The House Agriculture-FDA appropriations bill was passed by the House.

NOTE 2: Bills in the Senate were introduced by the Democratic chairs of the Labor-HHS and Agriculture-FDA appropriations subcommittees. The bills were not marked up in the subcommittees.

NOTE 3: Levels in this row do not include funding for ARPA-H.

NOTE 4: Includes funding provided through the 21st Century Cures Act. The amount in FY21 is \$195 million; in FY22, \$194 million; in FY23, \$216 million.

NOTE 5: The House bill and the Senate Democratic bill take different approaches to ARPA-H's structure and the overall NIH funding level. The Senate Democratic bill assumes that ARPA-H will be housed within NIH, so the bill's NIH total (\$47.959 billion) includes \$1 billion for ARPA-H on top of the NIH base funding. The House bill assumes that ARPA-H will be housed outside of NIH, so the bill's NIH total (\$47.459 billion) does not include ARPA-H funding.

NOTE 6: OVAC supports ARPA-H but did not recommend an amount for FY23.

NOTE 7: Amount does not include the Wisewoman heart disease program, which is housed within the breast and cervical cancer program. Within the total for this program, OVAC requests at least \$225 million for non-Wisewoman activities.
